

ABOUT

Dive into the vibrant world of *Cannery Row* as Richard Rodgers' mesmerizing music and Oscar Hammerstein II's compelling book and lyrics breathe life into John Steinbeck's treasured novels, *Cannery Row* and *Sweet Thursday*. Nominated for nine Tony Awards, including Best Musical, *Pipe Dream* weaves a tapestry of compassion, romance and hope among the drifters and dropouts who call Cannery Row home.

Set against the backdrop of the Bear Flag Café, which is more brothel than café, the musical follows Suzy, a homeless girl, welcomed by Fauna, the compassionate madam of the establishment. Amidst an eclectic group of characters, Suzy's encounter with Doc, a carefree marine biologist, sparks a tender and star-crossed romance. Rodgers & Hammerstein's musical takes on a warm and deeply personal tone, showcasing their benevolence for outcasts and illuminating the emotions and aspirations shared by all strata of society.

Critically acclaimed for its tender portrayal and enchanting score, *Pipe Dream* offers a poignant narrative of love and resilience amidst hard times on Cannery Row. Through the richly woven tales of longshoremen and individuals seeking their dreams, the musical paints a heartwarming picture of friendship and romance blossoming among the loners and dreamers on the Monterey, CA wharf. At its core, the musical captures the profound message echoed by Doc at the show's inception: "It takes all kinds of people to make up a world."

ABOUT THE CREATIVE TEAM

Richard Rodgers (Composer) was one of the great composers of musical theater, best known for his songwriting partnerships with Lorenz Hart and Oscar Hammerstein II. He received countless awards including Pulitzers, Tonys, Oscars, Grammys and Emmys. He wrote more than 900 published songs, and forty Broadway musicals. Born in New York City, Rodgers attended the same public school as Bennett Cerf, and studied at Columbia University where he met the lyricist, Lorenz Hart. In the 1920s and 1930s, Rodgers and Hart produced numerous successful musical comedies, including: The Garrick Gaieties, Dearest Enemy, A Connecticut Yankee, On Your Toes, Babes In Arms, Higher And Higher and Pal Joey. Their partnership came to an end with the death of Lorenz Hart in 1943. Rodgers, who had anticipated the end of the partnership, then began working with Oscar Hammerstein II, already a successful lyricist who had worked with Jerome Kern and others. Their first musical, Oklahoma!, was ground-breaking, and marked the beginning of the most successful partnership in Broadway musical history. This was followed by Carousel, Allegro, South Pacific, The King And I, Me And Juliet, Pipe Dream, Flower Drum Song and The Sound Of Music. The Rodgers & Hammerstein musicals earned a total of 34 Tony Awards, 15 Academy Awards, two Pulitzer Prizes, two Grammy Awards and two Emmy Awards. During this period, Rodgers also had one major solo project, writing the score to the NBC TV documentary series Victory At Sea. After Hammerstein's death in 1960, Rodgers continued to write music for Broadway. His solo career includes the music for No Strings, Do I Hear A Waltz?, Two By Two, Rex and I Remember Mama. For the film version of The Sound Of Music, he solo-wrote two songs: "I Have Confidence" and "Something Good," that had not appeared in the stage show. Richard Rodgers died at his home in New York City at the age of 77. In 1990 he was honored posthumously when the 46th Street Theatre was renamed The Richard Rodgers Theatre.

Oscar Hammerstein II (Book & Lyrics) was an American lyricist, librettist, theatrical producer, and (usually uncredited) director in musical theater for nearly 40 years. He won eight Tony Awards and two Academy Awards for Best Original Song. Many of his songs are standard repertoire for vocalists and jazz musicians. He co-wrote 850 songs. He is best known for his collaborations with composer Richard Rodgers, as the duo Rodgers and Hammerstein, whose musicals include *Oklahoma!*, *Carousel*, *South Pacific*, *The King and I* and *The Sound of Music*. Described by Stephen Sondheim as an "experimental playwright," Hammerstein helped bring the American musical to new maturity by popularizing musicals that focused on stories and character rather than the lighthearted entertainment that the musical had been known for beforehand. He also collaborated with Jerome Kern (with whom he wrote *Show Boat*), Vincent Youmans, Rudolf Friml, Richard A. Whiting and Sigmund Romberg.

John Ernst Steinbeck (Author of *Cannery Row & Sweet Thursday*) was an American writer. He won the 1962 Nobel Prize in Literature "for his realistic and imaginative writings, combining as they do sympathetic humor and keen social perception." He has been called "a giant of American letters." During his writing career, he authored 33 books, with one book co-authored

alongside Edward Ricketts, including 16 novels, six non-fiction books, and two collections of short stories. He is widely known for the comic novels *Tortilla Flat* (1935) and *Cannery Row* (1945), the multi-generation epic *East of Eden* (1952), and the novellas *The Red Pony* (1933) and *Of Mice and Men* (1937). The Pulitzer Prize—winning *The Grapes of Wrath* (1939) is considered Steinbeck's masterpiece and part of the American literary canon. By the 75th anniversary of its publishing date, it had sold 14 million copies. Most of Steinbeck's work is set in central California, particularly in the Salinas Valley and the California Coast Ranges region. His works frequently explored the themes of fate and injustice, especially as applied to downtrodden or everyman protagonists.

Kat Yen (Director) is a Taiwanese-American theater director, primarily living in NYC and Hawai'i. Recent productions include *Heart Strings* by Lee Cataluna, *Happy Life* by Kathy Ng, *Marisol* by José Rivera and *The Juniors* by Noah Diaz. Recent associate directing credits include *Redwood* written and directed by Tina Landau, *The Untitled Unauthorized Hunter S. Thompson Musical* by Joe Iconis and directed by Christopher Ashley and *The Comeuppance* by Branden Jacobs-Jenkins and directed by Eric Ting. Upcoming productions include *Kentucky* by Leah Nanako Winkler at Fordham University this fall and *The Heart Sellers* by Lloyd Suh at North Coast Repertory Theatre in early 2025. Kat is the inaugural Directing Fellow at La Jolla Playhouse, a former Resident Director at The Flea Theater, a Van Lier Directing Fellow at Second Stage and the co-founder and former Artistic Director of Spookfish Theatre Company. Isadora teaches and coaches dancers and actors at various institutions and festivals, and is adjunct faculty at The Juilliard School.

Jacob Kerzner (Music Director) is grateful to be returning to The Unicorn Theatre where he once played Youngest Scrooge in *A Christmas Carol*. He now serves as the Associate Editor for the *George and Ira Gershwin Critical Edition* at the University of Michigan, where he is the editing the forthcoming volumes *La, La, Lucille*, George's first full Broadway show including songs and orchestration recently rediscovered by Jacob, and *Of Thee I Sing*, the first "musical play" to win a Pulitzer Prize.
